This joint talk reviews eighteen months of ethnographical research and reciprocal collaboration between an Iranian socio-cultural anthropologist and one of the only ex-internee survivors of the Australian WWII internment camps. She was captured and detained with her German parents on Iranian soil in September 1941 after the British and Russian armies invaded.

Together, Helga Griffin (internee number R36356) and Pedram Khosronejad (Curator of Persian Arts, Powerhouse Museum, Sydney / Adjunct Professor, Western Sydney University) will discuss applied anthropological research methods and challenges faced during their close collaborations regarding

Helga's childhood memory, family immigrant archives and material culture (family photo albums, letters, etc.).
