

Panel Discussion: Türkiye after 2023: politics and international relations after the elections

Türkiye entered 2023, the centenary year of the Turkish Republic, with an anxiously anticipated general election. Amidst criticism of economic mismanagement, repression of civil society and political opposition and a delayed and disorganised response to the earthquake, Erdogan's AKP managed to win yet another parliamentary majority alongside of the presidential office. Beyond the analysis of the election results, our panel of experts will have a future-oriented discussion about what this result means for the country's democracy and the role it has to play in the region as well as in world politics.
