Following his retirement from DFAT, he returned to the ANU Centre for Arab and Islamic Studies where he was Adjunct Professor and Honorary Visiting Fellow.

He is the author of five books and numerous publications on Middle East issues, including among others the widely referenced *Palestinian Refugees: Mythology, Identity and the Search for Peace* and his book *Australia, Menzies and Suez* published in 2019.
