

Visiting Canberra

Accommodation:

There is a wide range of accommodation available in Canberra both on campus and in the city nearby. Conference participants are responsible for organising their own accommodation. For those wishing to stay on campus, we recommend booking early as spaces are limited.

On-campus:

University House

For arrival on the 21st November for a two night stay there is limited availability.

Standard Twin (single sized beds)- \$172.00 room only

Queen or Twin Suites \$199.00 room only

Guests can call direct to make a booking on 02-6125-5275. You need to mention the code name of “CAIS” to be offered the discount.

If u are booking accommodation, the rates are subject to availability as no rooms have been reserved. You will need to provide a credit card to secure your booking and can also add in breakfast if u wish to for an additional \$20.00 per night – per person.

Toad Hall (\$70 per night) - Toad Hall is a budget on-campus option. However, availability is limited so participants wanting to stay here should contact Toad Hall promptly.
